

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Stakeholder Feedback and Questions: <u>How is the rotating schedule the best choice for students who need routine or struggle with anxiety</u>?

We recognize that consistent routines are crucial for students with anxiety disorders. While the rotating schedule is designed to offer flexibility and equal access to various class times, we are exploring ways to provide additional support for students who need more stability. This includes working with counselors and creating predictable elements within the schedule to help students manage transitions better.

<u>The lines are so long at lunch that students are not being able to purchase before the lunch period ends.</u>

While the lines are longer this year, we have extended the lunch period. We have monitored the lunch service this week and found that the lines for lunch have consistently not been longer than 15-20 minutes. For instance, on Thursday, lunch began at 11:48am and the lines were cleared by 12:08pm (but remained open for those students who wanted a second lunch). Given that students have a total of 40 minutes for their lunch period, this timing ensures that they have adequate time to receive and enjoy their meal. Unless a student chose not to stand in line, all students have been served this week. Last year, we only had 30-minute lunch periods and the lines for lunch took between 10-15 minutes. We are continually assessing the efficiency of the lunch service and working with AAFES to adjust as needed to ensure a smooth process for everyone.

Are teachers required to have their classrooms open during lunch? Won't this take away from their time to plan?

Teachers are not required to keep their classrooms open during lunch. They have the option to do so if they choose, but this is entirely voluntary. The entire school is on lunch simultaneously, which means that teachers' planning time is preserved and not affected by lunch periods. This arrangement ensures that teachers have dedicated time for planning and preparation, separate from their lunch break.

We will continue to listen to stakeholder feedback to improve the experience for all students.

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Is there limited seating and are students are being forced to sit on the floors in the hallways? Do they have to eat outside in hot and cold weather?


Students are allowed to choose where they would like to eat on campus. While some students opt to eat outside, this is merely one of several options available. The cafeteria, auditorium, counseling suite and library are all open and available for students each day. There has been ample space in these areas, and students who choose to sit on the floor are doing so by personal preference rather than necessity. We aim to provide a comfortable and accommodating environment for all students. We encourage students to utilize the available seating areas, and we continue to monitor and manage these spaces to ensure that there is sufficient room for everyone. Our goal is to make sure that every student has access to a comfortable place to eat and that their lunchtime is a pleasant and stress-free experience. We are hoping to possibly open the gym up in the future so that students can walk or get exercise if they so choose. We ask for patience as everyone adjusts to the new bell schedule. We are working hard to ensure students know all the available areas where they can eat.

Why was the decision made to change the bell schedule?

The decision to change the bell schedule was based on stakeholder feedback and the need to address several issues. Our current cafeteria had become too small, forcing most students to stay in the cafeteria for the entire lunch period when we had three lunch sessions. There were requests for an open campus to reduce congestion and provide more freedom. Additionally, the three lunch tracks created scheduling conflicts, preventing students from having equitable access to all classes. Although a cafeteria expansion is planned, it will take a couple of years to complete.

Will the school provide more microwaves throughout the building?

One of our top priorities when we receive this year's funding is to purchase additional microwaves and outdoor seating. We intend to place the microwaves in various locations outside the cafeteria to make them more accessible.

<u>Please sign the enclosed Transportation Information Sheet and return to USAG Humphreys</u> <u>Student Transportation Office (STO)</u>. You may drop at the STO or place in a sealed envelope for the student to give to a teacher or bus attendant.

The STO is open from 8:30 a.m. – 14:00 p.m. (closed for lunch 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.). daily except on US Holidays. USAG Humphreys STO is located in Bldg. 558, Room 110. Please feel free to report any transportation related issues directly at 755-1230, 755-1224, or 755-1221.

Please remember and emphasize to your students, riding the school buses is a privilege and not a right. Students are responsible for complying with established school bus behavior.

The following rules should be observed; please go over these rules with your student.

- Students should be at bus stops five minutes before scheduled departure.
- Students will comply with the directions of the Security Attendant and/or bus driver.
- Students will be respectful to Security Attendants, bus driver, and each other.
- No pushing, shoving, throwing, or tripping (others).
- Students will sit in assigned seats if directed by Security Attendant or STO.
- Students will remain seated, with belt fastened, while bus is in motion.
- Keep noise to minimum so the driver can concentrate on safe driving.
- Students will not open windows, or extend any part of their bodies outside bus window.
- Students will not use inappropriate language or gestures.
- No eating or drinking on bus to include candy and chewing gum.
- No electronic devices allowed without use of headphones.
- Students must wear or carry their bus pass each day.
- Bus passes will be shown before entering the bus and upon demand.
- If bus pass is lost or stolen it can be replaced at the STO.

Pedestrian Rules

- Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
- If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.
- Keep alert at all times
- Whenever possible, cross streets at crosswalks or intersections, where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right.
- If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.
- Never assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.
- Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.
- Don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road.
- Don't play in streets, parking lots, and driveways.
- Don't ever run into the street.

Once buses are in motion only the school staff or STO personnel may direct buses to stop. The STO is responsible for reporting the discipline of students transported on school buses. The STO will notify **the school principal** upon receiving **three** reports of minor incidents from Security Attendants (i.e. talking too loudly, running in the bus lane, forgetting bus pass). One of student transportation officers will speak directly to parents after the **first and second** incidents, but will defer to **the school principal**, who may decide to deal with the student internally, or contact the parents for corrective action at home. Depending on the severity of any one incident, a report to the school principal may be sent sooner. Administrative actions can range from a warning, 5 to 30 days bus suspension, to removal of all bus riding privileges. For any incidents involving bullying, safety issues, or placing the student in an assigned seat, the STO will send an email or call the parents and will notify the school principal.

Please notify the STO if you or your student experience problems with an attendant. Do not confront or interfere with the performance of their duties.

Students attending **1st grade and below** who are not met at bus stops by an authorized individual will be returned to their **Elementary School Office** at USAG Humphreys. <u>All parents with students</u> <u>attending 1st grade and below must complete a "Student Escort Authorization Form" if they</u> <u>wish to allow designated representatives to pick their student up.</u> The form can be drop off at the STO or be emailed to humphreysbus@dodea.edu.

Dress Code Conduct & Consequences

The new DoDEA-wide student dress code:

- 1. Promotes one gender-neutral dress code across all three (3) regions.
- 2. Provides for a safe and orderly environment that promotes respect for learning and a common identity that reflects the Mission.
- 3. Establishes a positive, equitable approach to handling dress code infractions by using teachable moments to support changes in school attire choices while building problem solving skills.

School Dress Code

EFFECTIVE DATE JULY 1, 2023

Students MUST wear:

- Tops with sleeves (sleeveless tops/dresses are permitted for school sponsored formal events such as prom)
- Solid clothing (not transparent or translucent) that fully covers the top and bottom from armpit to mid-thigh
- Shoes (shoes must be safe for the school environment)
 - Bedroom slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal
 - Open toe shoes with a strap across the heel are allowed


Students CANNOT wear clothing with:

- Language or images promoting violence
- Language or images that depict, promote, or advocate the illegal use or sale of drugs, alcohol or tobacco products; violent conduct; curse words; pornography; that contain threats or expressions which are violent, discriminatory, lewd or obscene; or that advocate or promote any other illegal item or activity or the use of same
- Derogatory speech/imagery targeting groups based on race/color, ethnicity/national origin, sex/gender, sexual
 orientation, disability, religion, or any other characteristic protected by law
- Headgear that obscures the face (except as a religious observance or health purpose); clothing items with hoods attached can be worn but must not cover the head

* Teachers/courses can require certain attire as part of the curriculum (for example: physical education, culinary) that may include specific dress

(HHS will continue to document Dress Code violations by students.)

DoDEA students found to be outside of the DoDEA school dress code may be subject to various progressive teachable moments or corrective actions for confirmed or multiple instances of noncompliance including, but not limited to reteaching expectations, counseling, sponsor, parent, or legal guardian contact, or disciplinary action, if warranted in accordance with DoDEA Administrative Instruction 1347.01. A student is not to be removed from the classroom for DoDEA school dress code violations unless there is also a safety and/or welfare threat to the learning environment or that may impact or cause harm to other students. MEMORANDUM FOR DoDEA SPONSORS, PARENTS, AND LEGAL GUARDIANS

SUBJECT: Standard Response Protocol

1. A critical ingredient in the protection of DoDEA schools is the response to an incident. DoDEA schools plan for and conduct annual training with students, teachers, staff, and administration for weather events, fire, accidents, intruders, and other threats to student safety.

2. Our DoDEA school has adopted a standard response protocol, an all-hazards approach to DoDEA school emergencies. The standard response protocols have five (5) protocols: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

Ø	HOLD: if there is a situation that requires students or employees to remain in their current location
	SECURE : Secure is called when there is a threat or hazard outside of the school buildings or grounds.
0	LOCKDOWN : Lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard inside the school building or grounds.
(MM)	EVACUATE : Evacuate is called to move students and staff from one location to another.
Î	SHELTER : Shelter is called when the need for personal protection is necessary, e.g., tornado, hazardous material response, etc.

3. During the course of this school year, students and staff will train and conduct drills of these actions to better prepare ourselves for an emergency. Training is also available at the following website: https://www.dodea.edu/offices/security-management/school-training.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND **GUARDIANS**

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an allhazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

HOLD "In Your Classroom or Area"

Students are trained to:

• Clear the hallways and remain in their area or room until the "All Clear" is announced

Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

SECURE "Get Inside, Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

LOCKDOWN "Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"

Students are trained to:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE "To a Location"

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green • Card method.

SHELTER

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat
- Earthquake
- Tsunami

Safety Strategies might include:

- Evacuate to shelter area •
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground
- Students are trained in:
- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies

Adults and staff are trained in:

- Appropriate Hazards and Safety Strategies
- Accounting for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.









PARENT GUIDANCE

In the event of a live incident, parents may have questions about their role.

SECURE

"Get Inside. Lock outside doors"



Secure is called when there is something dangerous outside of the building. Students and staff are brought into the building and the outside doors will be locked. The school might display the Building is Secured poster on entry doors or nearby windows. Inside, it will be business as usual.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A SECURE EVENT?

Probably not. Every effort is made to conduct classes as normal during a secure event. Additionally, parents may be asked to stay outside during a Secure event.



WHAT IF PARENTS NEED **TO PICK UP THEIR** STUDENT?

Depending on the situation, it may not be safe to release the student. As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE?

When a secure event is brief or the hazard is non-violent. like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.

DCKDOW "Locks. Lights. Out of Sight"



A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL **DURING A LOCKDOWN?**

The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding. It is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are already in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as well.

SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

WHAT ABOUT **UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?**

The school may conduct unscheduled drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without announcing that it as a drill. That's called an unannounced drill and can cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.



It's important to differentiate between a drill and an exercise. A drill is used to create the "Muscle Memory" associated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event; this is simply performing the action. An exercise simulates an actual event to test the capacity of personnel and equipment.

CAN PARENTS OBSERVE OR PARTICIPATE IN THE DRILLS?

The school welcomes parents who wish to observe or participate in drills.

Tardy Table of Consequences:

(Tardies per Quarter)

1st unexcused tardy: no consequence

2nd unexcused tardy: no consequence

3rd unexcused tardy: 1 after school detention

4th unexcused tardy: 3 after school detentions

5th unexcused tardy: Saturday detention & Parent Meeting with the Administration *

6th unexcused tardy: 2 Saturday detentions & SST Referral* to determine next steps

*Per DoDEA Regulation 2095.01

**Students who are late from lunch will be given an automatic after-school detention at each occurrence.

**Tardy lock-outs will also be utilized to deter tardiness to class. In this scenario we will call a tardy lock-out over the public address system and ask teachers to close and lock their doors. Any student who is locked out will be required to report to the office for a pass to class and will be assigned an after-school detention.

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After school detention sessions are held from 3:15pm – 4:15pm Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Friday. (Location TBD)

If Saturday detention is assigned, you will be notified to whom and to where you are to report.

Students must bring work to complete with them to detention and a book to read if they finish their work before detention is over.

Students who are required to report to after-school and/or Saturday detention will be required to provide their own transportation in coordination with their parents.



HHS Cell Phone Use Policy

Purpose: The purpose of the HHS Cell Phone Policy is to ensure a conducive learning environment by minimizing distractions and disruptions caused using cell phones during school hours.

Policy:

- 1. In-Class Use: Cell phones must be turned off or set to silent mode and stored in backpacks during class time. Cell phones should not be visible or used unless explicitly permitted by the teacher for educational purposes.
- 2. Restroom and Hallway Use: The use of cell phones are strictly prohibited in restrooms and hallways during class time. This is to ensure student safety and maintain a respectful and distraction-free environment.
- 3. Use During Passing Periods and Lunch: Cell phones may be used during passing periods and lunchtime. However, students must ensure that their usage does not disrupt the school environment or violate the privacy and rights of others*.

*Per DoDEA Administrative Instruction 1353.01

Cell Phone Use Table of Consequences

Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action as per the school's disciplinary guidelines. This may include turning in the cell phone to the main office, detention, or other consequences as deemed appropriate by the school administration.

(Infractions Per Quarter)

1st infraction: Teacher Warning

2nd infraction: Teacher Conference with student

3rd infraction: Teacher Contacts Parent

4th infraction: Discipline Referral – 1 after school detention

5th infraction: Discipline Referral – 3 after school detentions

6th infraction: Discipline Referral – Saturday detention & Parent Meeting with the Administration (cell phone turned into the main office and picked up by parent)

7th infraction: Referral – 2 Saturday detentions

Attendance Policy

DoDEA Attendance

All students are required to attend school to ensure continuity of instruction and that they successfully meet academic standards and demonstrate continuous educational progress. School attendance is a joint responsibility between the parent or sponsor, student, classroom teacher, school personnel, and, in some cases, the Command. Students with excessive school absences (or tardiness) shall be monitored by administration, attendance clerk, and Student Support Team to assist in the completion of all required work and successful mastery of course objectives.

Participation in Interscholastic Athletic Programs, Far East Programs, & School Sponsored Non-Athletic Events (i.e. Homecoming, Prom, Spectator at Home Games, etc.)

- Students are required to be in school the full day on the day of a weekday game or non-athletic event.
- Students are required to be in school full day on Friday for a weekend game or event. The only exception is for an appointment approved by the school administration in advance.
- A student cannot be absent from school and attend practice except for an excused absence approved by the administration in advance.
- A student who is "unexcused absent" on the day of a scheduled athletic program or nonathletic event is ineligible for participation in that event.
- A student suspended from school is not eligible, at the minimum, for the next scheduled competition.
- Student attendance is recorded as "present school sponsored noncurricular activity."
- Students are responsible for identifying and making up all classroom activities or assignments which were missed because of being out of school while traveling to or from, and participating in, an Interscholastic Athletic Program or Far East Program.

DoDEA considers the following conditions to constitute reasonable cause for absence from school for reasons other than school-related activities:

- 1. Personal illness;
- 2. Medical, dental, or mental health appointment;
- 3. Serious illness in the student's immediate family;
- 4. A death in the student's immediate family or of a relative;
- 5. Religious holiday;
- 6. Emergency conditions such as fire, flood, or storm;
- 7. Unique family circumstances warranting absence and coordinated with school administration;
- 8. College visits that cannot be scheduled on non-school days; and

ATTENDANCE POLICY/PROCEDURES



In accordance with the policy stated in DoDEA Regulation 2095.01, "School Attendance," August 20, 2011, school attendance is mandatory. All students are required to attend school to ensure continuity of instruction and that they successfully meet academic standards and demonstrate continuous educational progress. For more information on our Attendance Policy, view our <u>Digital Handbook</u>. Please see below for school-specific information and procedures regarding Leaving Campus, Signing Out students, and Early Dismissal.

-Leaving Campus-

When a student is being checked out during the school day, a parent/sponsor/guardian must come to the Main Office to sign their student out. For safety and security reasons, HHS has a 100% ID policy, which requires all parents to show a picture ID when signing out/picking up a student. Once students return, they will receive a pass to their class. **This procedure is applicable to all students regardless of their age**.

If parents/sponsors/guardians do not sign out their students before leaving the school, the students will be considered truant and appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken.

-Signing Out-

Parents/sponsors/guardians must come to the Main Office, present a picture ID, and sign the student out using the sign-out computer.

Students will only be released to the parents/sponsors/guardians, or the emergency contact person in the student's registration file.

Once students are signed out, they must leave the school grounds.

Students may not be signed out of school to attend school activities of which they are not a member (e.g., athletic events, performances, etc.)

-Early Dismissal-

Requests for early dismissal should be presented by parents/sponsors/guardians in writing, when possible. Early dismissals requested over the phone will be approved ONLY after answering verification questions. Students are not allowed to sign themselves out, even if they are 18 years of age or older.

MEMORANDUM FOR STUDENT DRIVERS

Subject: Student Parking at Humphreys High School

Students who drive vehicles (i.e., automobiles, motorcycles, etc.) are required to register their vehicles with the front office. The purpose of this registration is to ensure everyone is aware of the responsibilities associated with driving and the expectations the school administration has for those students electing to drive to school. After reading the items listed below, both the student and parent are to sign this application form.

Students who return the completed application form along with proof of a valid Korean and/or US driver's license (not permit) AND a USFK Motor Vehicle Operator's Permit will be issued a school parking permit. Per USFK Reg 190-1, Licensing 2-1.i.4: *Individuals who only possess a learner's permit are only entitled to drive on a U.S. military installation during hours of daylight. They also must be accompanied by a USFK Form 134EK holder at all times*, will not qualify for a school parking permit.

Your "parking pass" will be issued following administrative approval and must be clearly displayed from your dashboard while parked on school grounds.

a. Only those students who have a valid USFK Motor Vehicle Operator's Permit and meet all the USFK requirements of licensing are allowed to drive to and from school without an adult. (USFK Reg 190-1).b. Students may use their vehicle before school, lunch, and after school, but at no other time during the school day.

c. Parent(s)/Sponsor(s) of students driving to school assume all liability for the wellbeing of passengers in cars driven by students. Parent(s)/Sponsor(s) recognize that Humphreys High School personnel will not be regularly monitoring cars with passengers.

d. All USFK motor vehicle regulations will be followed.

e. Any violation of driving with improper licensing will be reported to the base installation, civilian misconduct officer, and military police.

f. This policy is only in effect during regular school hours.

HHS Parking Permit

TIME TO RENEW YOUR STUDENT PARKING PERMIT FOR SY24-25

If you have a HHS student parking permit, it MUST be renewed annually. Visit the front office to renew your application.


